Florence often feels like a victim of its success-too beloved by the tourists who crowd its compact historic center, elbowing their way across the Ponte Vecchio bridge and enduring long lines for a look at Michelangelo's David statue.

So it's a relief to arrive at an elegant hotel like the 1865 Residenza d'Epoca. With only five rooms, each named for an author who once lived in Florence, this newly converted town house recalibrates your experience of the city. (It's near Sant'Ambrogio market, where locals are still in the majority.) The owners, opera singer Cinzia Borsotti and her husband, coordinate "secret Florence" itineraries as well as themed walks based on the haunts of authors like Henry James.
